The Economic Development Department is committed to promoting Amherst as a premier destination for businesses and residents. The Strategic Economic Development Plan was accepted by the Town Board in September 2023 and included an Implementation Strategy to assist the Town in focusing its economic development effort to improve efficiency and effectiveness. 
