Zone 1

143 HENDRICKS BOULVARD: After taking a year off we are back and excited to show off what we have been working on. Come and enjoy a mix of new and established gardens and hopefully take away a few ideas to add to your garden! * SAT ONLY.

523 LONGMEADOW ROAD: Cacti, Yucca, and succulents in the front or a little Southwest in the Northeast. Other gardens contain many perennials. Check out our 100+ year old Willow tree. * SAT. ONLY.

642 LONGMEADOW ROAD: More is more in this maximalists' paradise! A riot of colors and art with musical inspiration everywhere you look, always keeping our sights on fun!

699 LONGMEADOW ROAD: Large double lot filled with a colorful mix of annuals, perennials, and clematis vines. Special interest loads of garden art whimsy. A true "She Shed", pond and catalpa trees.

292 HEDSTROM DRIVE: Our gardens have various grasses, bamboo, hostas and loads of flowers for color. Our garden is on the "Oriental" theme

Hardscape elements include a lattice-top wood fence around the perimeter for climbing vines, a classic brick paver patio under a grapevine-draped pergola, a flagstone stepping stone path, and a potting shed. *SAT ONLY

475 MOUNT VERNON ROAD: A mixed garden of repurposed plants, flowers, trees and small statues. Just moved in a '67 Tag along for possible "she shed". Be sure to stop by and explore our garden!

Zone 2

66 BRIARHURST ROAD: A very different front yard garden featuring many perennials and annuals. Large focus on many varieties of day lilies and annual bulbs. The garden is very pollinator friendly and if you're lucky you may see a hummingbird or a variety of butterflies! *SAT ONLY

UB BIKE PATH/ ELLICOTT CREEK TRAIL COMMUNITY GARDEN: Circle Garden maintained by the Amherst Garden Club. Various perennials and annuals which bloom from Spring to Fall. Many of the plants attract bees and birds.

AMHERST STATE PARK, 400 Mill STREET: The Amherst Garden Club plants and maintains two gardens. The circle garden to the right as you enter and the garden at the grotto. Stop by and enjoy the wonderful gardens created by the volunteers.
