ZONE 1

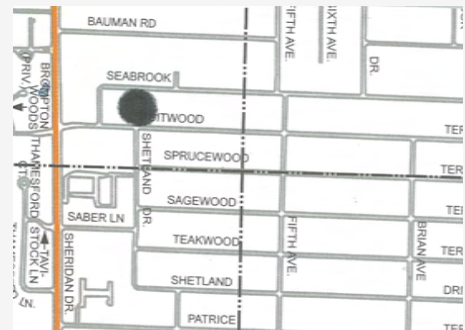

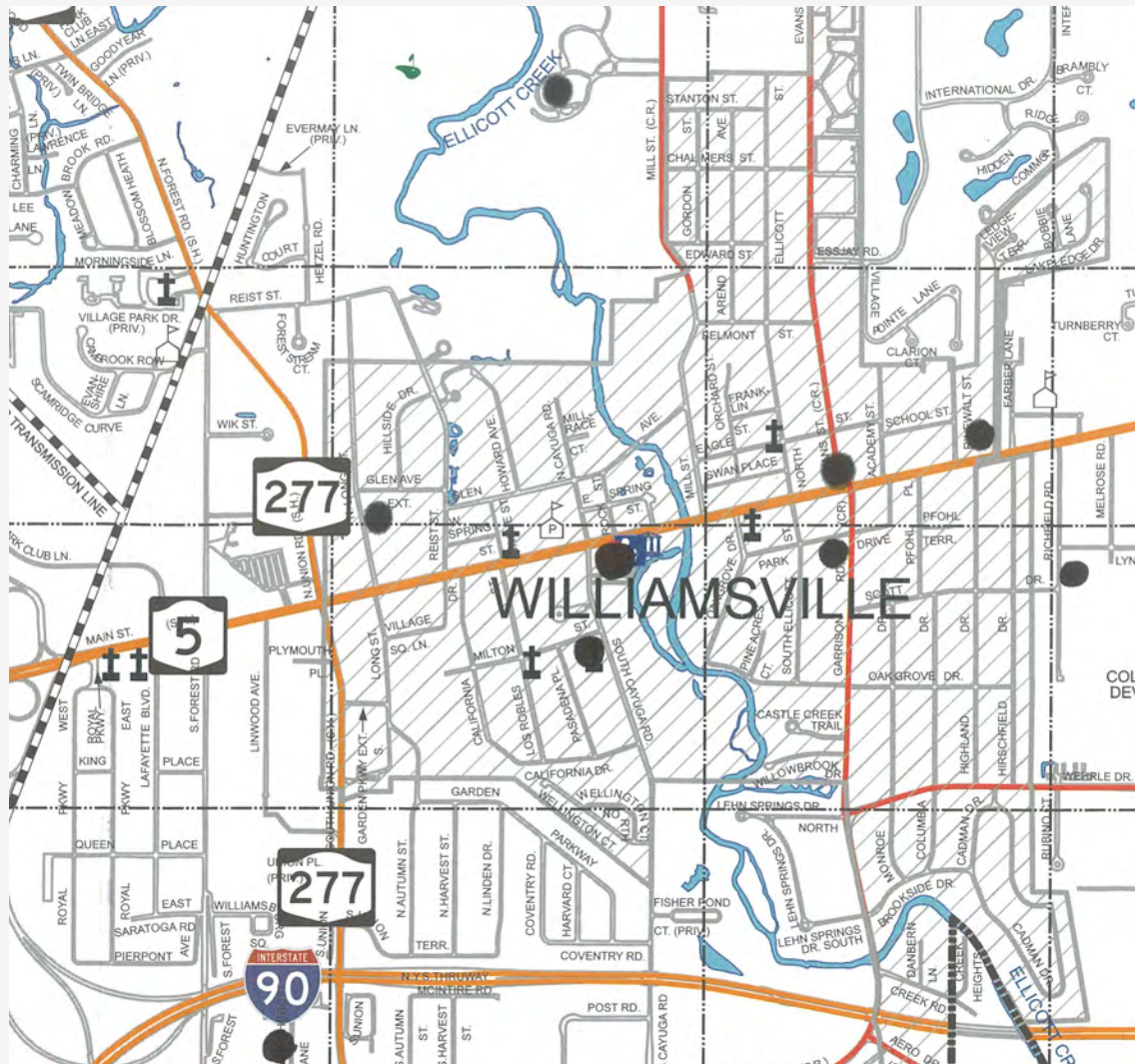
Map of Zone 2

120 Richfield Road: Cottage style garden featuring a waterfall and mural. Stop by and explore my garden and have some refreshments! (Open Sat Only)

5892 Main Street: Front garden features a colorful array of annuals and perennials. Featuring an art installation with an organic theme.

Main Street & Evans Road @ Traffic Triangle: Welcome to the Gateway garden into the Village of Williamsville. The garden is a tribute to Williamsville's role in the War of 1812. This garden offers a colorful and peaceful spot to sit and reflect. This garden is maintained by the volunteers of the Beautification Committee.

Garrison Road and Park Drive: Memory Garden, stroll the winding path through a whimsical garden with a mix of perennials and annuals. A must see garden for the children. This garden is maintained by the volunteers of the Beautification Committee.

The Mural Garden @ 5565 Main Street: A peaceful garden featuring public art, native plants and a pollinator habitat. We will be offering personalized tours from 10am to 1pm on Saturday. This garden is maintained by the volunteers of the Beautification Committee

20 Milton Street @ South Cayuga Road: Calvary Episcopal Church will present its Art and History Tour inside the church. We will serve as a rest stop for the garden walkers while offering refreshments. (Open Sat Only)

750 Wehrle Drive: An heirloom vegetable garden focusing on unique and historical varieties of both vegetables and flowers. Come and see all this at a 170 year old church as a backdrop.

51 North Long Street: Series of garden beds layered with various perennials such as roses, lavender, hydrangeas, hostas, viburnum and a small fenced in vegetable garden. Property bordered by mature pine and maple trees. Stop by a must see garden! (Open Sat Only)

Amherst State Park, 400 Mill Street: A mix of perennials and annuals adorn the grotto located in the back of park. The Amherst garden club maintains this garden.

ZONE 5

235 Sherbrooke Avenue: We have it all in our cottage styled garden! The birds utilize our bird houses and the pollinators love their garden. We have a pond and finish it off with our vegetable garden! (Open Sat Only)

30 Surrey Run: Koi pond is the main attraction along with numerous gardens throughout the property. We have many native species. Come and stroll through this beautiful property! (Open Sat Only)

UB Bike Path, North Forest/ Maple Road: The circle garden is maintained by The Amherst Garden Club. Lots of blooming takes place in this garden from Spring to Fall from the many perennials and annuals!

48 Old Orchard Street: Easy, elegant, colorful garden with some whimsy!

51 Old Orchard Street: This shady corner garden wraps around with several bright hostas, Sun King, Hydrangeas, Spirea and Day Lilies. A clean look with great rhythm throughout. (Open Sat Only)

96 Old Orchard Street: Hosta and Hydrangeas repeat across the front accented with white annuals. Giving the garden a clean look. A perfect Japanese Maple, Kousa Dogwood and some tough Boxwood gives this garden it's structure and evergreen!(Open Sat Only)

114 Old Orchard Street: Full and lush mixture of evergreen and deciduous shrubs accented with grasses, ferns, sunpatients and a two tone Japanese Maple that's a unique specimen. Boxwoods cross the front, they are a great example of beating the Boxwood moth! (Open Sat Only)

120 Old Orchard Street: This garden wraps around a long covered porch with boxwood hedges, hostas, coral bells, ninebark and grasses. The established plantings offer a clean and elegant look with good rhythm throughout the design. (Open Sat Only)

125 Old Orchard Street: This Spanish Colonial has beautiful architecture with an impressive garden full of bright colors. Established hydrangeas, and one of the most impressive Bloodgood Japanese Maple that dominates the focal point providing cool shade to the enclosed porch! (Open Sat Only)

128 Old Orchard Street: Meticulous maintained landscape featuring sculpted boxwoods, vibrant, seasonal flowers, mature specimen trees and a sweeping lawn that create a welcoming blend of elegance year round. (Open Sat Only)

133 Old Orchard Street: Established shade beds with large Rhododendron, Hydrangeas and an assortment of perennials. A cool spot even during the hottest part of the day under towering Ash trees. (Open on Sat. Only)

136 Old Orchard Street: Charming & formal, this garden welcomes you from every angle with bright pinks and deep reds. A young garden which has tremendous potential. This garden has great views and has an elegant look at dusk!(Open Sat Only)

144 Old Orchard Street: Courtyard water garden featuring 7 Japanese Maples, 3 mature Harbeans and over 100 species between 6 beds. Rain or Shine the gates will be (Open on Sat. Only)

150 Old Orchard Street: Hostas and evergreens bring balance and symmetry with a lush full look that gives this wrap around corner front yard a beautiful look. Several mature trees in front gives to shade throughout the day. Hydrangeas, Spirea, and lilies gives the pop of color! (Open Sat. Only)

252 Old Lyme Drive: A beautiful covered porch backs this garden full of candy corn Spirea, Quickfire Hydrangeas, and green Velvet Boxwoods. Two Bloodgood Japanese Maples stand on each corner and anchor the color across the front and along the side garden. (Open Sat. Only)

268 Old Lyme Drive: Morning sun garden facing East with beautiful Magnolias, Azaleas, Coral Bells, Phlox, Poppies, and Hydrangeas. Everything has it's place giving an elegant first look and even gets more beautiful the closer you look. (Open Sat Only)

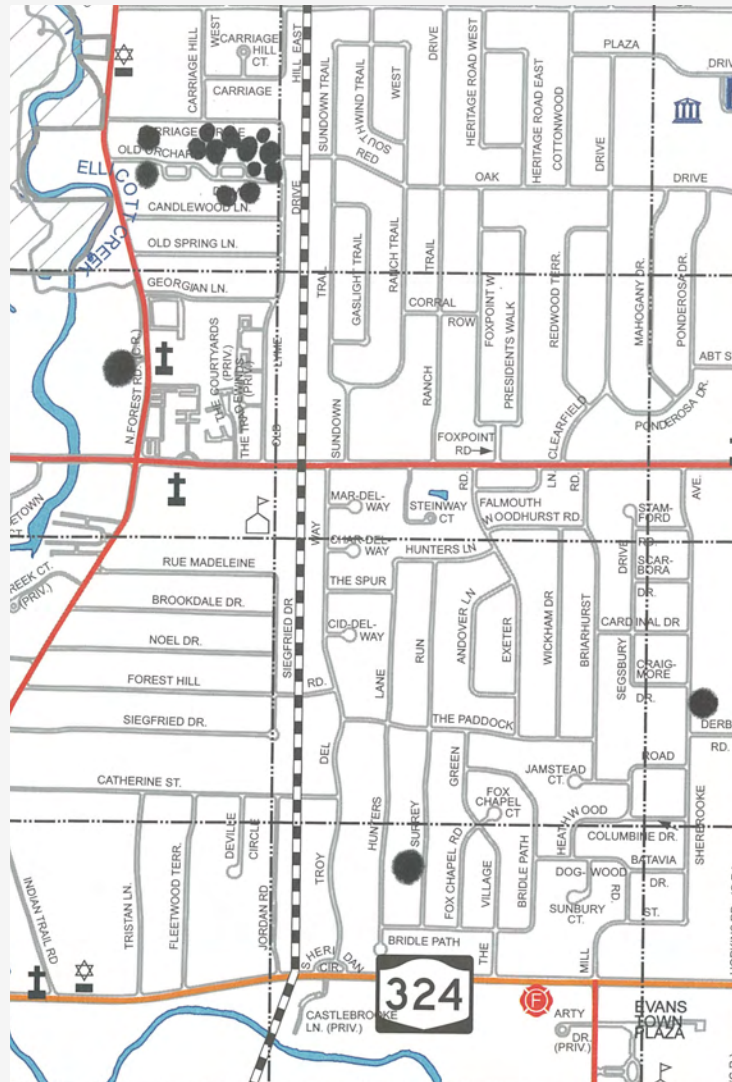

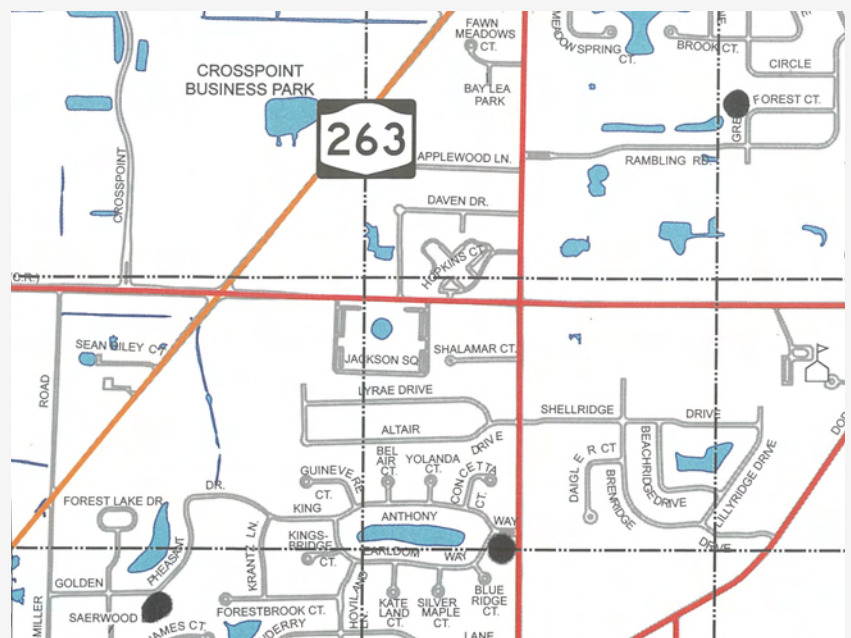
Map of Zone 5

67 Golden Pheasant Drive: Tropical pool garden! Come and explore the tropics! (Open Sat. Only)

1 Earldom Way: Beautiful pond with waterfall. Meandering pathways. Listen to the windchimes and admire the statues among the gardens. A must see!

88 Green Forest Court: Park like setting with fabulous strolling colorful garden beds. Planters like no other. Deck overlooking a pond. Stop by this garden and enjoy the beauty!

ZONE 7

- 66 Brancroft Lane:** My garden is a 50 year labor of love. Eclectic twist on traditional gardening! Please stop by and see my garden. (Open Sat Only)
- 73 Westchester Road:** This cottage-style garden blends diverse plants in flowering beds, creating peaceful tranquil paths that invite visitors to explore. Beds are mixed of perennials and unrecycled treasures.
- 8 Bentham Parkway:** Our garden features a mix of perennials and annuals in a range of settings from deep sunshine to shade. Sit for a moment by our recirculating stream and ring the bell in our Librarian's garden.
- 121 Chateau Terrace:** This lawn has been replaced by a mostly native perennial garden. There are over 180 species that are native to the Northeast. Stone pathways provide access and viewing. There's always something blooming!
- 110 Washington Highway:** Breathtaking garden created in 2011 including a back garden incorporating a series of blooms, vertical elements. Follow the flagstone stepping stones to the patio under the white pergola. Admire the natural stone walls and the quaint potting shed.
- 111 Campus Drive West:** The front gardens are full of hostas, day lilies and vibrant shades of annuals. On the side are perennials which leads your sight on a two tier waterfall koi pond. Back yard consists of perennials, flower pots and boxes and a 2 tier yard. Lots of seating areas, so take a seat and enjoy the view! Garden art nestled among the gardens.
- 457 Ruskin Road:** We began our garden 40 years ago to pay homage to the "Lost & Found" lifestyle. Nearly everything from furniture to pots and accessories are recycled & repurposed. A mix of annuals and perennials sprinkled throughout invite guests to relax by the pond. Fairy garden and many sculptures and garden art.
- 445 LeBrun Road:** Once again we have worked very hard to present our garden as a colorful display of lavish plants & objects of art for our neighbors & friends to view. Admire our mural on the backwall, 6 butterflies representing our grandchildren and a cardinal for my mother. Come and walk my labor of love.
- 699 Longmeadow Road:** Ever evolving color coordinated our large double lot. We offer garden whimsy, vintage tub & sink and a pergola. Annuals, perennials, wisteria, hydrangeas, hostas, and 25 clematis vines add to all of our colors. Small pond and a fun she shed. Lots of garden art!
- 640 Longmeadow Road:** A riotous and colorful ode to maximalism and whimsy taking the ethos of "more is more" to heart. (Open Sat Only)
- 523 Longmeadow Road:** Cacti, yucca, and succulents in the front "a little southwest in the northeast". My other gardens contain perennials and check out our 100+ year willow tree! (Open Sat Only)
- 520 Longmeadow Road:** Our garden is 3 years old and in the making. Focusing on herbs and wildflowers. We have a 14 year old magnolia tree and a rock garden including herkimer diamonds! Stop by and visit us.
- 85 Stevenson Boulevard:** Lush cottage style gardens with colorful sun and shade beds. Rustic rock walls, layered perennials, flowering shrubs and a charming pergola.
- 157 Delta Road:** We offer luscious gardens. Stop by and see us!
