Master Plan Process



Demographic Trends

2016 Statistics

- 123,185 residents
- 41.2 years old median age
- 49,733 households
- \$67,654 median household income
- 80% Caucasian, 10% Asian








Population Growth

Community Input Focus Groups & Public Meeting

10 Focus Groups & a Public Meeting (May 9 & 10)

Approximately 100 participants

Most were long time residents (20+ years)

Identified SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) of parks and recreation facilities and services

Focus Group Key Findings – Strengths

High quality programs, especially for youth.

Lots of praise for staff.

Northtown Center at Amherst = "flagship" facility and major regional ice sports hub and sports field complex.

Trails/paths are well used and valued.

Participants appreciate existing assets.

Focus Group Key Findings – Challenges

Level of basic maintenance is below expectations

Land acquisition/open space conservation is difficult

Many facilities are heavily programmed - little time for free/open use

Demand > capacity for fields, pickleball, aquatics, and indoor space.

Sites lacking infrastructure/comfort features (restrooms, seating, etc.)

Hard to find information (especially via town website)

Focus Group Key Findings – Priorities

A guiding vision for town parks, recreation, and open space is needed

Improve delivery of up-to-date information to the public

Strengthen existing joint use agreements and partnerships; explore opportunities for new partnerships

Enhance maintenance standards for parks and outdoor recreation areas

Create an interconnected system of pedestrian and bicycle trails

Community Survey Overview


Statistically Valid Survey

- 3,500 surveys mailed in July 2017
- 560 completed responses received (16.3% response rate)
- Margin of error +/-4.1% at 50% response
- Open Link Survey
- 243 responses



Top Ten Survey Findings

 $1 \longrightarrow 2 \longrightarrow 3 \longrightarrow 4 \longrightarrow 5$

Residents are somewhat familiar with Amherst's offerings, but a smaller percentage are very familiar. There may be potential to increase awareness of the Town's parks and facilities.

Programs and parks are widely used by families with children at home. Those who do not have children seem to participate in programs and visit sites less. There may be new opportunities to attract households that without children.

A large share of comments around recreation needs and opportunities focus on a need to protect open space and continued expansion/linking of green space. This finding is consistent with results in Erie County.

Improving communication strategies may lead to a higher degree of effectiveness. Residents stated a moderate to low effectiveness rate currently and identify the Town newsletter as the best method of communication.

Top Ten Survey Findings

6 -> - 7 -> - 8 -> - 9 -> - 10

In general community needs are being met by the majority of the facilities. There are a few key areas to monitor as they have high importance, but low needs met. These include aquatic facilities and programs/events.

When allocating dollars to projects, residents signal two actions as most important:


1) making improvements/re novating existing amenities and

2) preserving open space.

Safety and security, wellmaintained amenities, and pleasant settings are the primary drivers for why residents choose to visit parks. These three factors are vital reasons why residents pick their favorite areas to recreate. Creating a foundation for parks is the most desirable funding option for residents. On the contrary, invitation residents are much less likely to support sales tax increases or dedicated property taxes which fund parks.

Community events and fitness/wellness programs are most popular among Amherst's residents. These programs also receive high priority rankings. Close behind are programs which involve nature and outdoor recreation.





Amherst Parks & Recreation | Importance of Facilities to Household Sorted by Midpoint





High Importance/ High Needs Met

These amenities are important to most respondents and should be maintained in the future, but are less of a priority for improvements as needs are currently being adequately met.

These "niche" facilities have a small but passionate following, so measuring participation when planning for future improvements may prove to be valuable.


Low Importance/




Increasing use of parks and recreation facilities

Best means to inform the public




Most respondents want to receive information via the Town newsletter, Town website, or by email. Other media, including the Youth and Recreation Guide are important outreach tools.




Potential impact of user fee increases

- Categorized park sites, analyzed areas, and distribution of assets



Level of Service Analysis

- Most park areas are athletic complexes or community parks
- Parks are well distributed throughout Town
 - Larger Areas to the North
 - Neighborhood Parks in South
- Access to parks primarily by automobile; major pedestrian barriers
 - (ie. major road corridors, limited sidewalk/ trail connectivity)





Park System - Strengths

- Excellent athletic facilities (soccer, baseball, and softball)
- Ample existing open space in parks
- Good distribution of parks throughout Town
- Community parks close to residential areas
- Variety of amenities throughout park system







Park System - Weaknesses

- Aging/ dated facilities
- Accessibility (parking, playgrounds, facilities)
- Some facilities underutilized
- Limited security lighting within parks
- Difficult to find parks (wayfinding, signage)
- Lacking non-organized sport areas
- Connectivity with trails (neighborhoods to parks & parks to parks)
- Lacking arts and cultural events/ venues



Park System - Opportunities

- Improvements/ access to underutilized facilities and open space within parks
- Improved access and interpretation within nature/ conservation areas (signage, education)
- Improved Aquatic Facilities
- Multi-use pathway expansion
- Specialty Park Areas (Dog Park, Skate Park, Fit Trails, Paddle Boats, Bocce)
- Expanded Tonawanda Creek park area
- Environmental Enhancements







LOS Analysis - Recurring Themes

- Maintain & improve existing facilities
- Improvements/ access to underutilized facilities and open space within parks
- Expand multi-use pathway system
- Better utilize areas around the Tonawanda Creek and large nature areas
- Develop Specialty Park Areas (Dog Park, Skate Park, Fit Trails, Paddle Boats, Bocce)
- Acquire additional open space resources (as appropriate)
- Improved Aquatic Facilities (existing and new)

Inventory Summary

- Most parks are maintained in good condition but some locations have aged significantly
- Several parks need site furnishings to be replaced/ repaired
- More can be done to better utilize areas around the Tonawanda Creek and large nature areas
- Non-turf areas deserve some attention to help with drainage and erosion
- ADA accessibility is limited in many parks (overall audit)

Key Findings – composite of all research & analysis

- Improvement of existing assets is needed
 - Repair/replace aged infrastructure & amenities
 - Develop & implement measurable park grounds maintenance standards
 - Add comfort features (restrooms, lighting, shade, seating)
 - Develop specialized areas/amenities (dog park, skate park, fitness stations, bike repair station)
- An expand & connected multi-use trail system is highly desired
- Acquisition of additional open space is important to residents
- Access to high quality aquatic facilities is desired (improve existing & create new opportunities)

Key Findings – composite of all research & analysis

- Communication and Marketing efforts should be improved
 - Currently not easy to find current info about parks, programs, etc. Wayfinding and interpretive signage lacking (on trails, in parks)
 - Website needs significant functional and content enhancement
- Enhance special events and program offerings
 - Seek to expand opportunities for participation in popular programs/camps
 - Create new community-wide special events at parks throughout Amherst

Focus Areas for Enhancement

• Leverage Existing Assets

- Enhance existing parks and recreation facilities
 - Repair/replace aged infrastructure and amenities
 - Create measurable park grounds and amenity maintenance standards
 - Add comfort features and new amenities

Create New Recreation Opportunities

- Expand and connect multi-use trail opportunities
- Seek to acquire additional open space lands
- Bolster special events and program offerings

Develop Stronger Relationships

- Enhance sharing of information with users and public
 - Develop and implement a marketing and communications strategy
- Strengthen existing partnerships/joint use agreements
 - Seek new partnerships
