1800s History of Buffalo

Mike Casella, a lifelong resident of Western New York, worked at the GM Tonawanda Powertrain plant for 46 years. Toward the end of his career, a friend elicited his help for a history along the waterfront project. While doing research for the Buffalo River History Tour, he visited the Buffalo Harbor Museum and started to volunteer as a researcher. Casella has been a member of the board for three years and has written essays for their newsletter, the Harbormaster, which gets distributed to most cities along the Great Lakes.

His presentation will include the history of Buffalo, starting in the early 1800s as a small village on Lake Erie to becoming an industrial powerhouse. He will cover the creation of the Buffalo Creek into a large harbor and the #1 grain port in the world. Other items included will be the story of Buffalo’s water supply, grain elevators, and some maritime disasters.
