



Providing year-round help to residents and worthwhile paying job opportunities for teens

Are you a teen looking for a way to earn some extra money?

Are you an Amherst or Williamsville resident in need of assistance with extra work around your home?

Here's How it Works:

For Residents:

1.) YouthWork\$ receives calls from residents of Amherst who need assistance in, or around their homes. A youth participant is then contacted about the job possibility. If interested in the job, the youth is given the resident's contact information and then calls the resident to discuss the time the job is to be accomplished and the salary to be earned. Youth are contacted based upon requests made in their neighborhood area.

2.) Our youth do a variety of jobs (see application for examples). We are very concerned about teen safety. Please do not ask us to send someone to do jobs that require climbing ladders, roof work, carrying heavy/large objects up or down stairs, provide childcare with use of a pool or trampoline, or anything that would require driving, as we will be unable to fill those positions.

The YouthWork\$ staff would like this to be a positive experience for both teens and residents. Our staff is available to answer questions or to take job information from residents during office hours. You may also leave a detailed message after hours and we will return your call promptly. 3.) The price paid to the teen by the resident for the work is decided between both parties, but should be at least the minimum wage for the first hour or less, and for each additional hour. Exceptions to this are <u>babysitting</u>, <u>shoveling</u>, and <u>mowing</u>. (These should be decided fairly between the youth, their parent and the resident, before the work is to be done.) We ask that you <u>pay the youth at the end of each day's work</u>, even when the job requires working more than one day.

adult residents and teens. We would like involvement in this program to be a positive experience for young people. Although we try to make sure the job is safe for teens to do, we do not personally interview each adult that calls us. Adult assistance and encouragement are important aspects of this program. It is up to you as a parent, to make sure your child is safe doing whatever jobs the resident needs done. We encourage you to talk to your child before and after working for a resident. It is important that you are aware of all the details regarding the job. You may also want to consider accompanying your child on the initial visit. Getting to know the resident is an important safeguard. We are sure you would like to meet the resident for whom your child will be working. Please encourage your child to complete the upper part of the application, then check it over and have them make changes as necessary (this is good experience for your child when filling out job applications in the future). Please also fill out the bottom portion completely and sign it. The application can then be mailed to the address listed above. We will be in contact with your child when we have a job in your area that would be of interest to him/her, based on information from his or her application. We cannot provide a job opportunity if there is no signature from a parent or guardian.
